A course for nurses and practitioners working in primary and secondary care

# PHILOSOPHY

This course aims to equip practitioners with the knowledge and clinical skills to enable them to provide holistic care for patients with aural problems

The course examines the principles and practice of promoting ear health and the prevention and treatment of aural problems

On completion, participants will:-

- Have critically considered the clinical management of aural problems in the light of current knowledge and research
- Be able to identify common aural conditions and give the appropriate treatment and care
- Have an understanding of different types of deafness and the correct use of screening tools

# **COURSE CONTENT**

The course consists of 5 taught days, followed by 3 months' practical experience. During this time, a mentor is required to provide support and supervision to complete a programme of clinical competence
